### FACT

Youth who experience homelessness are much less likely to obtain a high school diploma or GED, and have a high prevalence of suicide attempts, mental and physical illness, unemployment, incarceration, and pregnancy.



At least 2,000 young people each year are looking for a home in Kent County.

80 youth, ages 18-24, experience homelessness every night.

## OUR RESPONSE

THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD) HAS RECENTLY RECOGNIZED YOUTH AS A FOCUS POPULATION FOR THE ALLOCATION OF HOUSING RESOURCES, DUE TO THEIR HIGH NEEDS AND THEIR POTENTIAL FOR GROWTH.

So we develop housing and supportive services to meet this need. We believe that safe and secure housing is an inherent human need and, once satisfied, allows a person to move forward towards his or her future.



We develop safe, affordable housing for youth experiencing homelessness, partnering in their transition to healthy interdependence.

### OUR RESULTS

7 stable employments with 3 youth receiving job promotions.

\$2000 funds employment support and youth advocacy for 4 to 8 youth per month.

\$320 funds community dinners for one house for a month, building relationship and employment skills.

3 young people are safe and stably housed after moving on from a 3:11 home. In total, our youth have saved over \$1,700 for future housing through rental payments.

\$200 subsidizes rent for one youth for a month.

\$800 subsidizes rent for 4 youth.

As a result of growing community partnerships and youth success, we plan to open two new homes in 2016 and 2017, increasing our impact throughout Kent County.
